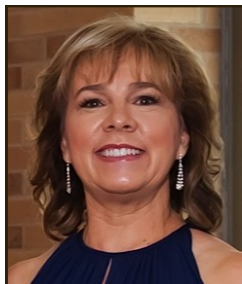

She chairs the Shelby County Breastfeeding Coalition, Co-Leads the TIPQC Breastfeeding Promotion Projects, is a Co-Chapter Breastfeeding Coordinator for Tennessee AAP, and active member of the Section on Breastfeeding of the AAP. She is an Assistant Clinical Professor at UT Health Science Center, in the Department of Pediatrics.

Report on the progression of maternity care practices including Kangaroo Care, breastfeeding initiation, mother-infant separation, staff training in maternity care hospitals according to the mPINC scores for Kentucky and future opportunities for improvement.

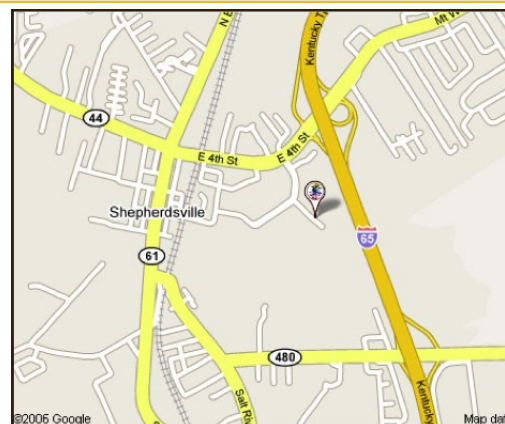
